GENERAL INFORMATION

Student Eligibility

In order to be eligible to apply for a Moral Courage Scholarship, the following two eligibility requirements must be met.

- 1. **SCHOOL GRADE REQUIREMENT:** The applicant must be enrolled in the 12th grade in a public school, charter school, private school, or home school during the current school year.
- **2. LOCAL RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT:** In addition to meeting the School Grade Requirement, applicant must meet ONE of the following two Local Residency Requirements.
 - a. EITHER The applicant's school must be located in Waxahachie, Texas.
 - b. OR The applicant must live in Ellis County, Texas; and must have maintained active membership in (or regularly attended) a church located within the geographical boundaries of the Waxahachie Independent School District, for the two-year period prior to the beginning of the current school year.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Basis for Selection of Scholarship Recipients

The **MISSION** of the Moral Courage Foundation is to inspire young people to live up to the moral standards of the Bible and to encourage young people to courageously promote those values in our society.

The Moral Courage Foundation will carry out its mission by providing college scholarships to high school graduates who have demonstrated biblical moral courage in their lives as defined below.

1. MORALITY

Morality begins with a respect for God and for His will as expressed in the inspired writings of the Bible. The concept of morality has its roots in the Ten Commandments and is further developed through the writings of the New Testament.

The Moral Courage Foundation is seeking young people who are committed to the pursuit of biblical morality in their personal lives. Specifically, we are looking for young people whose lives are characterized by the following traits and behaviors:

- Compassion
- Kindness
- Forgiveness
- Service to others
- Integrity
- Honesty
- Freedom from addictive behaviors
- Sexual Purity (a commitment to the ideal that sexual relations are appropriate only in a monogamous marriage relationship between one man and one woman)
- A demonstrated relationship with God, including active involvement in a local church

For further elaboration on morality, you are encouraged to consult the following Bible passages: Exodus 20:1-17, 1 Corinthians 6:9-11, Galatians 5:19-23.

2. COURAGE

In addition to a personal pursuit of biblical morality, it is also important to take an active role in promoting biblical morality at the societal level. The Moral Courage Foundation is seeking young people who are willing to take a public stand for biblical morality even in the face of opposition, rejection, or persecution.

SECTION 5: Essays

You will be required to submit two one-page essays with your scholarship application.

- Each essay may be either handwritten or typed.
- Use a separate sheet of paper for each essay.
- Do not exceed one page for each essay.
- Put your name and the essay title at the top of each essay.

ESSAY #1: "About Me"

Write a one-page essay telling us about yourself. Below are some guidelines for things to include in this essay, in no particular order. The purpose of this essay is to give the Scholarship Selection Committee a good understanding of who you are and what makes you unique, especially as a person of character, integrity, and moral courage.

Things to include in this essay:

- Your spiritual journey, your relationship with God, and how these have impacted your life and the lives of those around you.
- Your church involvement during your high school years, and why it is important to you to be actively involved in church.
- Your involvement in community service during your high school years, and why it is important to you to serve your local community.
- Talk about how you have made a positive difference in your family, your peer group(s), your community, and/or your high school.
- What are your plans for the future? Specifically: Where do you plan to further your education after high school? What degree plan or area of study will you pursue, and why? What career path do you plan to follow, and why?

ESSAY #2: "What Moral Courage Means to Me"

Please carefully and thoroughly read the "Basis for Selection of Scholarship Recipients" on page 2 of this application packet, *including the Bible passages* listed there. It is important to understand that true moral courage is defined by the Bible's standards of morality, and that those standards are often in conflict with society's standards of morality and with what is considered politically correct at the moment. We are looking for young people who courageously stand for *biblical* morality. With those thoughts in mind, write a one-page essay describing what the concept of "moral courage" means to you. Why is moral courage important, and how has it played a role in your life? Give some examples of situations in which you have acted on moral courage, especially any situations in which you have exhibited moral courage by taking a stand *for* biblical morals, or by taking a stand *against* the immoral beliefs and practices in the world around you.

SECTION 6: Character References

You will be required to have three different people submit character references on your behalf as part of the scholarship application process. These should be people who know you well enough to comment on your moral integrity.

The Character Reference Requests (CRRs) that you will need to provide to these three people are included in this scholarship packet and may also be downloaded and printed from the Moral Courage Foundation website (www.moralcouragefoundation.org). Each CRR is slightly different, so be sure you give the right CRR to the right person. Before distributing the CRRs, write your name in the "Applicant's Name" box on each CRR.

All character references must be mailed directly to the Moral Courage Foundation by the person providing the character reference and must be postmarked by the postmark deadline specified in the CRR.

Here are some guidelines to consider when selecting people to submit character references on your behalf. (NOTE: It is your responsibility to provide each of these people with the appropriate CRR.)

Character Reference 1: MINISTER OR CHURCH LEADER

This should be your preacher, pastor, youth minister, an elder, or some other recognized leader in the church you regularly attend.

Character Reference 2: HIGH SCHOOL TEACHER OR ADMINISTRATOR

This should be one of your high school teachers, a principal, your school counselor, or some other faculty or staff member at your high school.

Character Reference 3: COMMUNITY SERVICE LEADER OR OTHER ADULT

This should be someone who has supervised you in your community service activities or is well acquainted with your community service efforts, or any other adult who knows you well enough to comment on your moral integrity. NOTE: This cannot be your parent or guardian, and cannot be the same person as Character Reference 1 or Character Reference 2.
